COMPETITION RULES

Rules for the Competition are as follows:

Each entry must be some form of second hand CHAIR from either a market, second hand store, council clean up, tip or something that you have inherited.

Definition for CHAIR – adult or child’s, backed or not backed, single seat or maximum of two in the case of a bench or stool style, primary role must be for sitting.

EACH CHAIR MUST BE ABLE TO BE LIFTED BY ONE PERSON.

Each entry must include a profile and a before photo of your Chair. We would like a short history of where you obtained the Chair and anything else of interest about the piece.

The work does not have to be an original design but include in your profile the source of your design.

Each entry must be hand painted with Decorative or Folk Art.

Each entry carries an entry fee of \$5.

You may enter no more than one CHAIR in the Competition.

Official Entry forms will be published in the first FDAA Newsletter for 2010.

All entrants must be a current member of the FDAA as at June 2010.

All entries are to be done by individuals not a combined effort or retail shop.

Entries may be sold at the Fair but not removed until Sunday evening after the Fair has closed.

The winning entry will be decided in a popular vote by the public who visit the FDAA Exhibition, Hall 3 at the Craft & Quilt Show, Darling Harbour.

The competition will run throughout the five days of the fair with the winning entry being announced at 3pm on Sunday 20th June 2010.

There will be no division into category or styles.

The entry receiving the most number of votes will be deemed the winner, receiving \$500 as the winner.

Presentation will be made to the winner at August General Meeting 2010.
