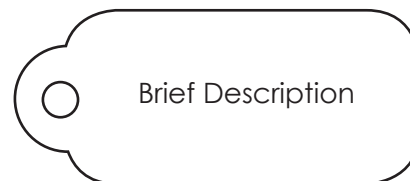
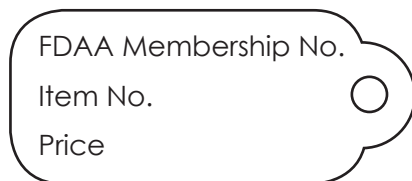


GENERAL SALES GUIDELINES

1. Articles are to be painted in Folk Art or Decorative styles containing no less than 80% painting.
2. Decoupage is not accepted without some painted decoration on the item. If applicable Decoupage is to be written on the back of the price tag.
3. All small jewellery items to be mounted on members own board.
4. All items are to be individually tagged, numbered and priced on the Inventory Form.
5. All items must be prepared and finished properly - hooks and batteries on clocks
6. All items with a function such as a clock or pen must be in working order
7. Price tags to be swing tags or removable self adhesive labels, of a reasonable size (minimum 3.5 cms) and clearly marked with membership number, item number and price on one side of the label. On reverse of label write a description of item for sale. (Avery & Esselte make a range of removable self adhesive labels; both these and swing tags are available from Newsagents or stationery stores)



8. FDAA Canvas Tags to be used to label all canvases. Place tag at the base of canvas.
9. All prices are to be the nearest dollar.
10. Inventory Form and price tags are to be completed before arriving for check in.
11. No buying or selling at check-in.
12. All sale items to be at Darling Harbour by 2 pm Tuesday (Set up day) Heritage Markets before market opens.
13. Donations of painted items for future FDAA fund-raising are made at the completion of each sale. A receptacle will be made available. If you are not available to pack up your items on completion of a sale, an item will be selected by a committee member from your unsold items. Your committee thanks you in advance for your donation.
